Tater Tots & Beef Casserole

- 2 pounds lean ground beef or pork
- 2 (10 ounce) cans golden mushroom soup / can substitute regular mush room soup
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese you can use whatever grated cheese you have
- 1 (2 pound) package frozen tater tots
- 1. Pat ground beef into greased 9 x 13 inch pan.
- 2. Spread soup over meat, cover with grated cheese and top with tater tots.
- 3. Bake uncovered at 350 for 1 hour. Bake covered for softer tater tots.
