
Fall Road Trash Clean up

ABC News Warns Massive Swine Flu Spread

Vaccine may be available next month

By fall half of the American population could be infected with H1N1 Swine Flu. 60-120 million will get sick, 30 million infected with no symptoms, 1-8 million hospitalized & 90,000 possible deaths. More deaths will occur among children. It has been tested in laboratory animals that the Swine Flu is spread more easily through direct contact since animals in adjacent cages did not spread the flu, but animals in cages together infected one another. There is a vaccine under development & it could be released as early as next month. The vaccine will consist of 2 shots separated by 3 weeks; the patient will be protected only after the 2nd shot.

Help prevent the spread of the swine flu by washing your hands & staying away from other people if you feel ill. Children sick with Swine Flu sent to school can spread this fly easily.
